PART 4B: THE CALLING OF MOSES

GOD'S CALLING UPON MOSES AND HIS ARGUMENT

The Bible gives us two chapters in which it is laid out how God approached Moses, and how Moses time and time again said that it could not be done, that no one would believe him and that he was not qualified to do the job:

- □ Who am I that I should go? Exodus 3:11
- □ I don't even know your name. Verse 13
- □ The people will not believe that you sent me. Exodus 4:1
- □ I am of slow speech, I can't talk in public. Verse 10
- Send someone else. Verse 13

MOSES' ACCEPTANCE OF GOD'S WILL

- □ When Moses faced the anger of God, he decided it was better to take the job, than to face the wrath of God. **Verse 18**
- □ It is important to note, Moses did not discuss his new job for God with his wife, he just told her to pack up and go with him! Verse 20
- □ If you know that God has spoken to you and the road is laid out before you, there is only one thing to do if you want to be blessed, *do what you are told!*
- Abraham did (Genesis 22:1-3) but Jonah did not. Jonah 1:1-17

EVERY SAVED PERSON HAS A GENERAL CALLING

- □ There are two places in the New Testament in which Jesus calls believers into action. Matthew 28:18-20; Mark 16:15-20
- Every believer in Christ has been given the following authority. Luke 9:1-5, 10:1-21
- □ To have this power, you must maintain a holy walk. Luke 9:23-26
- □ Once you put your hand to the plow, do not turn back. Luke 9:57-62
