SHARING CHRIST WITH OTHERS

Many Christians are often intimidated about sharing the Gospel, but if we truly realized the gravity of the situation, we wouldn't hesitate. Look at the following quotes by Charles Thomas Studd (1860-1931) and Charles Haddon Spurgeon (1834-1892).

"The best training for a soldier of Christ is not merely a theological college. They always seem to turn out sausages of varying lengths, tied at each end, without the glorious freedom a Christian ought to abound and rejoice in. You see, when in hand-to-hand conflict with the world and the devil, neat little biblical confectionery is like shooting lions with a peashooter: one needs a man who will let himself go and deliver blows right and left as hard as he can hit, trusting in the Holy Ghost. It's experience, not preaching that hurts the devil and confounds the world. The training is not that of the schools but of the market: it's the hot, free heart and not the balanced head that knocks the devil out. Nothing but forked-lightning Christians will count. A lost reputation is the best degree for Christ's service. It is not so much the degree of arts that is needed, but that of hearts, loyal and true, that love not their lives to the death: large and loving hearts which seek to save the lost multitudes, rather than guard the ninety-nine well-fed sheep in the British pen...

"Some want to live within the sound of church or chapel bell; I want to run a rescue shop within a yard of hell. If Jesus Christ is God and died for me, then no sacrifice can be too great for me to make for Him. God has called me to go, and I will go. I will blaze the trail though my grave may only become a stepping stone that younger men may follow." C.T. Studd

"If sinners will be damned, at least let them leap to hell over our bodies. And if they will perish, let them perish with our arms around their knees, imploring them to stay. If hell must be filled, at least let it be filled in the teeth of our exertions, and let not one go there unwarned and unprayed for." C.H. Spurgeon

So what hinders us in sharing the Gospel? Fear! Fear of failure. Fear of rejection. Fear of the unknown. It is fear and a lack of concern for our fellow man.

UNDERSTANDING OUR SIN NATURE

UNDERSTANDING THE NEED FOR THE CROSS

God is wrathful judge who is also rich in mercy. He sent Jesus to live on the earth as a human being so that we could be forgiven. If you look at it from a legal viewpoint, we broke God's law, but Jesus paid the fine. That means that God can legally dismiss our case and give us everlasting life. **Romans 3:19-26; 5:6-15**

It doesn't matter who we think deserves hell or not, God is the one with the power to kill and cast into hell. He knows your thoughts and judges them in perfect holiness; every single transgression of the law will come out as evidence of your guilt. The wrath of God abides on you; if you refuse mercy, you will get justice. **John 3:36**

Think about your sins and don't forget that God is also rich in mercy and willing to forgive. **Hebrews 4:12-16**

Jesus paid a debt He did not owe because you owe a debt you could not pay. The law simply shows your need for a Savior. **Galatians 3:22-24**
