THE VIRTUAL TIME RUN

During the virtual time run, the Godhead observed how Lucifer was able to pervert their plan for the descendants of Abraham and knew there would be heavy losses when the Hebrews were removed from Egypt.

They knew the Israelites would not successfully drive out the pagans from the Promised Land and this would lead the descendants of Abraham into pagan worship. They realized that many would perish when enticed by Satan to reject God. Only a remnant from each generation would choose to remain true to the Godhead.

During the time of the judges, the Godhead was repeatedly forced to intervene with judgment for disobedience and deliverance when the people repented.

As the Godhead looked upon the first three kings, they soon realized that Saul did not have the necessary resolve to wholeheartedly serve them. The next choice was taken down by his sexual lust, and even if David repented of his shortcomings, his offspring were morally weak.

The virtual time run continued to reveal the weakness of mankind in relation to Lucifer's temptations. The united kingdom would be split for better control.

KING SOLOMON

The reign of King Solomon did not start well. Shortly before he passed away, David requested that Solomon kill Joab, the faithful commander of David's army, and Shimei, who had mocked David at a low point in his life. Solomon obeyed his father and both men were executed. Solomon solidified his reign by murdering his brother, Adonijah.

Solomon was a bit of an enigma.

1. He started his reign as a murderer.
 - a. Adonijah – **1 Kings 2:22-25**
 - b. Joab – **1 Kings 2:28-34**
 - c. Shimei – **1 Kings 2:41-46**
2. Solomon befriended the king of Tyre who was possessed by Lucifer. **Ezekiel 28:1-4; 11-16**

King Hiram plays a great role in Freemasonry and the city of Tyre is a holy place to them.

3. At the dedication of the temple, Solomon prayed and the fire of the Lord came down upon the temple. **2 Chronicles 7:1-3; 12-15**
4. Solomon penned the following books of the Bible:



- a. Proverbs
 - b. Song of Solomon
 - c. Ecclesiastes.
5. Solomon became a devout Satan worshiper toward the end of his life. **1 Kings 11:1-9**
 6. Solomon fully embraced the Kabbalah. His kabbalistic name was 666 and he enhanced the kabbalistic writings, laying the foundation for the future Antichrist. **1 Kings 10:14-20; Revelation 13:18**

POINT OF NO RETURN

The people of Israel never recovered after the reign of Solomon. The nation reached its zenith militarily and politically during his rule, but Solomon's sins were so great and the debauchery so deep that God split the kingdom into two parts. Neither part survived, and with the fall of Judah in 587 BC, the nation was forever lost. The wisdom bestowed upon Solomon was manipulated by Satan to destroy him. **1 Kings 4:29-34**

From 907 BC to 681 BC (226 years), the northern kingdom of Israel had eighteen kings. Only Jehu served God partially; the rest of the kings were pagan worshipers that led their people down a dark hole from which there was no rescue.

From 907 BC to 587 BC (320 years) the southern kingdom of Judah likewise had eighteen kings. Four of them walked with God completely, five served God partially, while the other nine actively served Lucifer and led the people into pagan worship.

There were two bloodlines on parallel tracks from among the descendants of Abraham:

- ❖ THE MESSIAH LINE was based upon the Torah, the Prophets and the Writings. **Matthew 5:17-19**
- ❖ THE ANTICHRIST LINE was based upon the Kabbalah and the Talmud.

One day, the true Messiah of God, Jesus, will return in glory from heaven and once and for all put the false messiah in the place reserved for him and his master, Lucifer – the Lake of Fire. **Revelation 19:11-21**

THE BABYLONIAN CAPTIVITY

The virtual time run showed there was no redeeming the tribes of the northern kingdom. This was similar to the Amorites upon whom God had pronounced a death sentence because of their iniquity and this is why the Israelites were taken captive and scattered throughout the Assyrian empire. **Genesis 15:16**

The southern tribes of Judah and Benjamin would be punished and taken to Babylon, but a remnant would return to Judah and Jerusalem. The Godhead placed two powerful prophets in Babylon (Daniel and Ezekiel) to give guidance to the remnant that chose to follow the Godhead. **Daniel 1:1-6; Ezekiel 1:1-3**

When the time came to for a departure to Jerusalem after 70 years of exile, God raised up three men (Zerubbabel, Ezra and Nehemiah) who not only led them back to Judah,

but provided leadership in rebuilding the temple, the walls of Jerusalem, and establishing Judah as a self-governing province of Persia. **Ezra 2:1-2**

Two prophets were raised up to build the faith of the people. **Ezra 5:1; 7:6; Nehemiah 1:1-6**

THE SILENT YEARS

Nehemiah returned to Persia in 372 BC and Judea was governed by a high priest until 331 BC when Alexander the Great defeated Persia. There were no further prophets during the time that remained before the incarnation of Jesus.

Alexander's kingdom was divided into four pieces after his death. The Seleucid kingdom possessed Syria, Babylon and Persia, while the Ptolemy kingdom ruled over Egypt. The Seleucids and Ptolemys fought for supremacy over Judea.

Lucifer was moderately successful in polluting the Jews with Greek culture. Seleucid armies swept into their territory to set up pagan worship at the temple in Jerusalem and forbid the worship of the God of Abraham, Isaac and Jacob.

Joshua Ben Sirach rose up and set up a system of Torah teaching that pushed back against Hellenization and pointed a large portion of the Jews to their godly roots.

The pressure from the Seleucids sparked an uprising in 167 BC when Mattathias and his five sons revolted against the imposed idolatry and desecration. This led to the Maccabean uprising.

The Maccabees gained control over Jerusalem and the temple two years later. They cleansed the temple, and this was the beginning of Hannukah, a holiday that Jews have observed since that time.

The Jews ruled themselves for the next 98 years until the Romans arrived in force.

THE ROMAN ERA

General Pompey seized control of Jerusalem in 67 BC and entered the temple compound where some 12,000 priests, temple guards, and civilians were ruthlessly killed.

There was a power vacuum in Judea due to two Roman civil wars. Antigonus took control of Jerusalem and declared himself king in 40 BC, but the Roman army returned and a great slaughter took place in 37 BC.

An Idumean named Herod was able to secure a vassal kingship over Judea and Jerusalem. Herod the Great would reign for the next 40 years and it was under his rule that Jesus was incarnated in Bethlehem.

THE MESSIAH IS COMING

The time had finally arrived when holy angels seized control of Judea. A young woman named Mary was contacted by Gabriel and informed that she was going to be the mother of the Messiah. **Luke 1:26-36**

Gabriel also visited Zacharias in the temple and notified him that he was going to be the father of John the Baptist, who would prepare the way for the Son of God. **Luke 1:5-20**

Joseph, the man betrothed to Mary was also contacted by an angel and informed of the heavenly proceedings. **Matthew 1:18-25**

Angels showed up in a large assembly after Mary gave birth to the incarnated body of Jesus. **Luke 2:8-18**

It had taken the Godhead some 4,116 years to prepare the world to receive the promised Messiah. The origin story of Jesus planned in eternity past was finally fulfilled.

Humanity's redemption would conclude with a stunning ending when Jesus was crucified some 33.5 years later. It was the end of the beginning when the Son of God was bodily resurrected three days later, forever defeating Lucifer and sealing his fate in the Lake of Fire.

Do not forget that the overwhelming majority of Abraham's descendants down through the ages died in their sins and ended up in hell. **Romans 9:27; Isaiah 10:22**
